Chief DalPorto has been with the Niagara Falls Police Department since 1997, and has built a strong reputation as an efficient, effective, and collaboration-minded law enforcement leader. First hired as a corrections officer, today he leads the police force that handles approximately 65,000 calls for service annually. He was promoted to Chief in 2013, edging out candidates from across the country and is the perfect bridge between the NFPD's proud history and its excellent work today.

Under Chief DalPorto, the NFPD has become a strong proponent of the principles of community policing and the need for transparency, by developing strong community partnerships and expanding the Department's use of body cameras.

Chief DalPorto knows well that education and citizen involvement are key to maintaining a healthy relationship with the community. He is a member of the MLK program committee in Niagara Falls and has expanded programs bringing diverse groups into contact with the Department. He has also created a number of initiatives like the Business District Initiative, the Retail Crime Task Force, bike patrol, and Project Impact as a way to both engage with the community and keep safe its people and businesses while maintaining the highest levels of respect for individual rights and dignity.
