Crystal is a Mentor with the WNY Coalition of Multicultural Offices of Higher Education, and is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority and the Puerto Rican & Hispanic Day Parade Association. She established the first City of Buffalo Women's History Month Celebration and participates in the Racial Equity Roundtable.
