Highly involved with the community, she has given her time to both the National and New York State Indian Education Associations, the Niagara Falls Public Library, Focus on Families, United Way, the Niagara Falls Human Right's Council, the Niagara County Youth Council, the Indian Defense League of America, and she was Chair of the Title IV IEA Parent Committee.
